SUBJECT: RADIOACTIVE WASTE MANAGEMENT

1. PURPOSE. This Chapter correlates to DOE O 435.1 (formerly DOE 5820.2A), RADIOACTIVE WASTE MANAGEMENT, dated September 26, 1988, by assigning responsibility and accountability and providing administrative and/or contractual guidance to the Oak Ridge Operations (ORO) and those contractors identified in paragraph 3 below. Nothing in this issuance changes any requirements contained in any DOE Order.
2. CANCELLATION. This Chapter cancels and replaces ORIG 5820.2B, RADIOACTIVE WASTE MANAGEMENT, dated July 14, 1994.
3. APPLICABILITY. The provisions of this Chapter apply to ORO Principal Staff and to contractors and subcontractors performing work that involves management of waste containing radioactivity and/or radioactively contaminated facilities of DOE under the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, as required by law and/or contract.
4. RESPONSIBILITIES.
 - a. Assistant Manager for Environmental Management establishes waste management requirements for all waste generated under ORO jurisdiction and ensures that waste management and surplus facility operations comply with DOE O 435.1 and all applicable Federal, state, and local statutes.
 - b. Director, Waste Management Division, performs those tasks identified in DOE O 435.1, subparagraphs 8j(2), (4), and (5).
 - c. Contracting Officers' Representatives are responsible for those tasks listed in DOE O 435.1, subparagraphs 8j(1), (3), (6)-(8), and (10).

CONTRACTOR REQUIREMENTS DOCUMENT

Contractors that are identified in paragraph 3 of this Chapter shall accomplish the following:

1. Establish programs to minimize the generation of and manage the treatment, storage, transportation, and/or disposal of radioactive wastes, and the pollutants or hazardous substances they contain, in a manner that complies with all applicable Federal, state, and local environmental, safety, and health laws, regulations, and DOE requirements.
2. For management of high-level, transuranic, and low-level waste, and management of waste containing naturally occurring and accelerator produced radioactive material, develop programs that conform to DOE O 435.1, Chapters I through IV, paragraph 3, REQUIREMENTS.
3. Prepare a waste management plan that conforms in format and content to DOE O 435.1, Chapter VI and Attachment VI-1 for each site that generates, treats, stores, or disposes of waste.
