


# Nuclear Nonproliferation Treaty

Dr. Scheinman has written widely on nonproliferation, international nuclear safeguards, international technology cooperation, political integration, and international law. Most recently he served as Policy Advisor to the IAEA Experts Group study on Multilateral Nuclear Alternatives. He also served as Special Assistant to the Director General of the IAEA (Hans Blix); in this role, he focused on nonproliferation and arms control.

He has held a number of government posts, including Assistant Director (Assistant Secretary), United States Arms Control and Disarmament Agency, responsible for Nonproliferation and Regional Arms Control (Clinton Administration); Counselor for Nonproliferation in the Department of Energy (Clinton Administration); Principal Deputy to the Deputy Undersecretary of State and Advisor to the Undersecretary (Carter Administration); and Head of the Office of International Planning, Energy Research and Development Administration (Ford Administration).

Lawrence Scheinman (A.B.P.H.D, J.D.) is currently distinguished professor of International Policy with the Center for Nonproliferation Studies at the Monterey Institute of International Studies, and Adjunct Professor, Georgetown University School of Foreign Service.
