Business Visa versus Tourism Visa / I-94 Automation

If a traveler is on a Visitor Visa or ESTA the Department of Energy (DOE) requires B1/WB for any business conducted with Oak Ridge National Laboratory.

To increase efficiency, reduce operating costs, and streamline the admissions process, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) has automated the Form I-94 at air, sea, and land ports of entry. The paper form is no longer provided to a traveler upon arrival except in limited circumstances. Travelers may be given a CBP admission stamp on their travel document. If a traveler needs a copy of his or her status or I-94 (record of admission) for verification of alien registration, immigration status, or employment authorization, one can be obtained from <https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov> or the CBP One™ mobile app.

IF the I-94 reflects either WT/B2 (which indicates “tourism”) the traveler will be unable to discuss business with the ORNL host until the issue is resolved. If this mistake is not realized until arriving at ORNL, an email must be sent to the Memphis Border and Customs Office to get it corrected. Due to this, it is important the traveler double check the I-94 website prior to leaving THE PORT OF ENTRY into the United States.
